Background



In the context of a EC founded project on Homeland Security, Biometrics Identification & Personal Detection Ethics - HIDE (www.hideproject.org), a problem-solving workshop is being organized which aims to bring together individuals and representatives from the European governmental and non-governmental organisations, with the emphasis on the New Member and Balkan States, to identify and discuss ethical and other issues related to the restrictions of the scope of rights in the implementation of EU data-protection principles when such restrictions constitute the necessary measures to safeguard important public interests, security and defence.

This workshop is part of the HIDE project activities, whose mission is to establish a platform devoted to monitor the ethical and privacy implications of biometrics and personal detection technologies. HIDE is a research collaboration between 11 partners from Europe, Singapore and USA, and is coordinated by Prof. Emilio Mordini, Centre for Science, Society and Citizenship (CSSC), Rome, Italy.

Workshop Format



The workshop is designed to bring together individuals from different sides of the privacy vs. security conflict in a “safe” environment to address questions that are otherwise difficult to discuss. An important goal in this workshop is strengthening the perception that further dialogue among the participants is going to be fruitful due to increased insights into each other's perspectives, and the sense that conversation is of value. This workshop is thus designed to reach two parallel and coordinated results:

- First, it should encourage an analytical approach to joint problem solving that will be conducive to the emergence of creative win-win solutions;
- Second, it should also alter stereotyped, negative, and rigid images and thereby pave the way for a constructive approach to debated issues.

The workshop programme is divided into an introductory section followed by four main sessions. The maximum number of speakers per session is four. Each presentation will be approximately 20 minutes, including questions and answers. The presentations will be followed by a dialogue and discussion between the participants.
